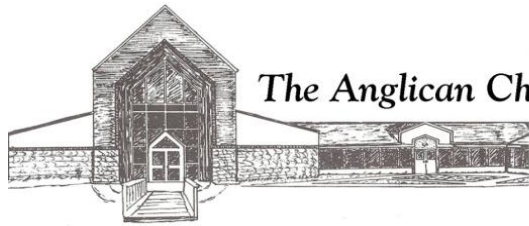

OUTREACH

F.O.O.D. Committee (Feeding Others of Dartmouth): During the period of lent which starts Wednesday, **February 26th and ends Saturday, April 11th**, the F.O.O.D. Committee will be doing a special collection for Margaret's House of hygiene products. Upon consultation with Margaret's House the most needed hygiene products are men's razors, shaving cream, deodorant, combs, and nail clippers. Other item such as shampoo, tooth brushes, tooth paste, dental floss, soap, etc. are also helpful. The items will be collected in the Narthex in the boxed marked "Hygiene Products for Margaret's House". 85% of Margaret's House clients are men and 15% are women. These items will be delivered to Margaret's House in March and April along with our regular monthly donations of food items and homemade desserts which are delivered the last Friday of each month. This church outreach is supported by donations from our parishioners. If you would like to make a monetary donation you can put it in a church envelope and mark it for the F.O.O.D. Committee. Also include your envelope number or name on the envelope as the donation will be included on your income tax receipt.
